Wharton County, TX Tuesday, September 14, 2021 0800 hours

For the period of September 6 – September 12, Wharton County Office of Emergency Management received a report from the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS), Houston office, that we have **two hundred nine (209)** new positive cases of COVID-19. Our regional hospitalization rate (Trauma Service Area "Q") is currently at **20.38%**. The number of active COVID-19 cases in our county is now at **three hundred twenty-three (323)**. We cannot stress enough the importance of using all available tools to curb the infection rate: Wear the mask when unable to socially distance or asked, maintain a safe distance, wash your hands or use hand sanitizer frequently, and for those still unvaccinated and do not have medical reasons why they cannot – get the vaccine.

Sadly, we must report that since September 1, **twelve (12)** more of our residents have succumbed to this disease, bringing our total to **one hundred forty-one (141)**.
