## Wharton County, TX, Friday, June 12, 2020 1330 hours

Wharton County Office of Emergency Management has received a report today from the Texas Department of State Health Services that we have **zero (0)** new positive cases of COVID-19 and **no (0)** new recoveries to report.

The total who have tested positive for COVID-19 is now **eighty-five (85)** in Wharton County and we have had **forty-two (42)** reported cases who have recovered and sadly, one death. Wharton County has **forty-two (42)** active COVID-19 cases.

Next week Wharton County will have 5 days of testing at 3 different locations.
