Wharton County Office of Emergency Management has received a report today from the Texas Department of State Health Services that we have **nine (9)** new positive cases of COVID-19 and **no (0)** new recoveries to report.

The total who have tested positive for COVID-19 is now **eighty-five (85)** in Wharton County and we have had **forty-two (42)** reported cases who have recovered and sadly, one death. Wharton County has **forty-two (42)** active COVID-19 cases.

We are often asked why our numbers and the numbers from DSHS don't exactly match day to day. Currently, the State has a number of cases that have positive test results, but they have not yet confirmed all of the vital information they need in order to correctly report to the county level.

Next week Wharton County will have 5 days of testing at 3 different locations.
