Wharton County Office of Emergency Management has received reports from the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS), Houston office, that we have **three (3)** new positive cases of COVID-19, and **four (4)** recoveries. We have been notified of **no (0)** additional fatalities due to COVID-19, thus our total number of deaths remains at **forty-seven (47)**. Our fourteen day total of new confirmed cases is now at **thirty-six (36)**, that does NOT include any probables.

IMPORTANT: County-wide testing will be next Tuesday, October 20, at the El Campo Civic Center, 8 am - 4 pm. No prior registration is necessary. This is a free test.
