The second item on the agenda was Roll Call and Excuses Absences. All members were present.

The third item on the agenda was Public Comments. The Public Comments were as follows:

- 1. Charlotte A. Bess stated she wanted to know when the levee would be built.
- 2. Mary Barnes stated that she wanted to know why the City closed flood gates along the railroad. Ms. Barnes wanted to know why a flood gate was install on the East side of Wharton but not the West Side.
- 3. Wayne Allen stated that he wanted to know what he could do to help.
- 4. Lawrence Armour stated one option would be a total buyout of the West side of Wharton which he said would be 1/3 the cost of the levee. He also suggested to raise all structures on the West side of Wharton instead of building the levee.
- 5. Rodrick Temple stated he wanted to know what couldn't the City dig the river deeper.
- 6. Sandra Curtis stated that she wanted to know what factor lead to shutting off flood gates at FM 120. Ms. Curtis also asked why the City could not get funds or raise funds for the Levee Project.

The fourth item on the agenda was the Wharton Moment. No comments were given.

The fifth item discussed on the agenda was to review and consider a resolution of the Wharton City Council approving the application for the 2016 Homeland Security Federal Grant and authorizing the Mayor of the City of Wharton to execute all documents related to said application. City Manager Andres Garza, Jr. presented a memo from Chief Terry Lynch regarding the 2016 Homeland Security Federal Grant. Chief Lynch stated that the grant was for \$60,445.95 with no matching funds from the City required. After some discussion, Councilmember Don Mueller moved to approve City of Wharton Resolution No. 2016-40, which read as follows:
