MINUTES OF

CITY OF WHARTON SPECIAL CITY COUNCIL MEETING AUGUST 30, 2016

Mayor Tim Barker declared a Regular Meeting duly open for the transaction of business at 7:00 P.M at City Hall 120 E. Caney Street Wharton, TX. Airport Manager David Allen led the opening devotion and Mayor Barker led the pledge of allegiance.

Councilmember's present were: Mayor Tim Barker and Councilmembers Al Bryant,

Joan Andel, City Secretary Paula Favors, TRMC, Assistant to the City Manager Brandi Jimenez, Police Chief Terry David Lynch, Airport Manager David Allen and Facilities Maintenance Director Bob Baker.

Visitors present were: Matt Cartier with Waste Corporation of American

(WCA).

The second item on the agenda was Roll Call and Excuses Absences. After some discussion, Councilmember Russell Machann moved to excuse Councilmember Don Mueller. Councilmember Al Bryant seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

The third item on the agenda was Public Comments. No comments were given.

The fourth item on the agenda was the Wharton Moment. No comments were given.

The fifth item on the agenda was to review and consider a resolution of the Wharton City Council approving an agreement with a grant consulting firm to assist the City with public communication and outreach to potential grant participants, grant application development, grant project management and grant administration under FEMA's HMA mitigation grant program, HUD, USDA, and any other Federal or State of Texas agency and authorizing the Mayor of the City of Wharton to execute all documents related to said agreement. City Manager Andres Garza, Jr. stated that two proposals were received on August 23, 2016 for the project management and grant administration grant program and reviewed at the August 24, 2016 Finance Committee Meeting. City Manager Garza said the Committee voted to interview the two firms on August 29, 2016 at 12:00 noon and then rank the firms. He said the Committee was recommending City Council consider entering into an agreement with CB & I Environmental & Infrastructure, Inc. After some discussion,

Councilmember Al Bryant moved to approve City of Wharton Resolution No. 2016-51, which read as follows:

- **WHEREAS,** The City of Wharton and CB&I Environmental & Infrastructure, Inc. wishes to be bound the conditions outlined in the contract; and,
- **WHEREAS,** The Wharton City Council wishes to authorize the Mayor of the City of Wharton to execute the agreement.

The seventh item on the agenda was to review and consider Waste Corporation of America, L.P. (WCA) Rate Modification to the Solid Waste Collection and Disposal Service Franchise Agreement:

A. Resolution: A resolution of the Wharton City Council approving the Amendment No. 9 to the Franchise Agreement for Solid Waste Collection Services with Waste Corporation of America and authorizing the Mayor to execute the agreement.

City Manager Andres Garza, Jr. presented a copy of the memorandum dated August 24, 2016 from Finance Director Joan Andel providing a copy of the letter dated August 15, 2016 from Mr. Trevor Royal of Waste Corporation of America (WCA) regarding their rate modification regarding to the Solid Waste Collection and Disposal Service Franchise between the City of Wharton and WCA. City Manager Garza stated that WCA could request rate modifications in accordance with Section 14.00, Basis and Methods of Payment, Item 14.02 Modification of Rates of the General Specifications of the Franchise Agreement. He said the rate would need to be approved by the City Council on August 30, 2016 in order for it to be effective October 1, 2016 and as Mr. Royal stated, the rate increase is 4.66% in accordance with the price index mentioned in the City's franchise agreement with WCA. City Manager Garza said the City Council Finance Committee met on August 24, 2016 and after the review voted to recommend to the City Council the requested rate modifications. After some discussion, Councilmember Al Bryant moved to approve City of Wharton Resolution No. 2016-53, which read as follows:

WHEREAS, WCA and the City of Wharton wishes to be bound by the conditions outlined the agreement; and,

WHEREAS, The Wharton City Council wishes to authorize the Mayor of the City of Wharton to execute all documents related to the agreement; and,

WHEREAS, This resolution is passed in accordance with said contract.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WHARTON, TEXAS as follows:

Ordinance: An ordinance repealing and replacing the City of Wharton Code of Ordinances, Chapter 86 Utilities and Services, Article III, Solid Waste Disposal Exhibit A, Providing that a violation of the ordinance or any part of the Code as adopted hereby shall constitute a penalty upon conviction of a fine and setting an effective date.

City Manager Andres Garza, Jr. presented a draft ordinance that would amend the City Ordinance on solid waste charges. After some discussion, Councilmember Al Bryant moved to approve City of Wharton Ordinance No. 2016-07, which read as follows:

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING AND REPLACING THE CITY OF WHARTON CODE OF ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 86 UTILITIES & SERVICE, ARTICLE III, SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL EXHIBIT A; PROVIDING THAT A VIOLATION OF THE ORDINANCE OR ANY PART OF THE CODE AS ADOPTED HEREBY SHALL CONSTITUTE A PENALTY UPON CONVICTION OF A FINE AND SETTING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Wharton, Texas, that Chapter 86 Utilities & Service, Article III Solid Waste Disposal Exhibit A shall be replaced as follows:

Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, any person found guilty of intentionally, knowingly or recklessly violating any provision of this article and upon conviction thereof in the municipal court shall be fined in accordance with the terms of Section 1-5 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Wharton, Texas.
