## MINUTES OF CITY OF WHARTON

# REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING April 25, 2011

Mayor Domingo Montalvo, Jr. declared a Regular Meeting duly open for the transaction of business at 7:00 P.M. Councilmember Bryce D. Kocian led the opening devotion and Mayor Domingo Montalvo, Jr. led the pledge of allegiance.

Councilmember's present were: Mayor Domingo Montalvo, Jr., Councilmembers Terry

David Lynch, Don Mueller, Alfred Bryant and Bryce D.

Councilmember absent was: Jeff Gubbels.

Staff members present were: City Manager Andres Garza, Jr., Finance Director Joan

Andel, City Secretary Paula Favors, Assistant to City Manager Jackie Jansky, Public Works Director Carter

Miska, and City Attorney Paul Webb.

Visitors present were: John Merculief II with Wharton Journal Spectator, David

Schroeder with Wharton Economic Development

Corporation, Rachel Rust, Paul Sherland, Richard Arnold,

and I.O. Coleman, Jr.

The second item on the agenda was Roll Call and Excuses Absences. After some discussion, Councilmember Don Mueller moved to excuse Councilmember Jeff Gubbels. Councilmember Alfred Bryant seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

The third item on the agenda was Public Comments. Mr. Paul Sherland addressed the City Council and informed them that the Wharton Economic Development Corporation's Market Wharton Committee created a website located at <a href="www.whartontxproud.com">www.whartontxproud.com</a>. Mr. Sherland added the committee was taking steps to promote Wharton in a positive light. No action was taken.

The fourth item discussed on the agenda was the Wharton Moment. Councilmember Don Mueller complimented the Wharton Fire Department for doing an outstanding job handling a gas leak at Briar Pointe Apartments. Mayor Domingo Montalvo, Jr. added that it was encouraging to see the fire department working well together and training was paying off. Councilmember Bryce D. Kocian stated that Spring Sweep would be held Saturday, April 30, 2011 at the Wharton County Junior College for Wharton residents to take part in. No action was taken.

The fifth item on the agenda was to review and consider the City of Wharton Financial Report for the month of March 2011. Finance Director Joan Andel presented the financial report for the

month of March 2011. Mrs. Andel stated that the total ad valorem taxes collected were \$36,531.50 and the sales tax for the month of March 2011 was \$83,057.44. She further stated that the TexPool balance for March was \$2,292,590.03 with an average monthly yield of 0.15%. She said Prosperity Bank balance for March 2011 was \$1,449,687.86 with an average monthly yield of 0.15%. Mrs. Andel further stated that other investments included \$2,659.05 at TexasGulf Federal Credit Union in the debt fund, and \$255,199.69 at Capital One Marketing at a rate of 2%. After some discussion, Councilmember Don Mueller moved to approve the City of Wharton Financial Report for the month of March 2011. Councilmember Bryce D. Kocian seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

The sixth item on the agenda item was to review and consider City of Wharton Annual Financial Report for the fiscal year, October 1, 2009 to September 30, 2010 by Harrison, Waldrop, & Uherek, L.L.P. Mayor Montalvo informed the public that the auditor had not completed their review and this item along with item seven and eight were being pulled from the agenda. There was no discussion and no action taken.

The seventh item on the agenda was executive session.

**A. Discussion**: The evaluation of City Manager and Finance Director regarding the City's financial matters.

There was no discussion and no action taken.

The eighth item on the agenda was to return to open session.

**A: Review & Consider**: The evaluation of City Manager and Finance Director regarding the City's financial matters.

There was no discussion and no action taken.

The ninth item on the agenda was to review and consider the City of Wharton Budget Calendar for fiscal year 2011-2012. Finance Director Joan Andel presented the proposed calendar to the City Council. Mrs. Andel advised the City Council that budget workshops would take place July 12, 2011 and August 9, 2011 at 6:00 p.m. at the Wharton Civic Center. After some discussion, no action was taken.

The tenth item on the agenda was to review and consider a request by Mr. Richard Arnold for an over 50% variance request for the placement of a 10' x 21' portable carport at Pecan Acres, Block 1, Lot 34A; 217 Kincaid Avenue. City Manager Andres Garza, Jr. presented a copy of the City of Wharton City Council Application for an Over 50% Variance submitted by Mr. Richard Arnold, property owner, requesting a four (4) feet two (2) inch side yard setback variance from the required five (5) feet side yard setback requirement for the placement of a 10' x 21' portable carport at Pecan Acres, Block 1, Lot 34A; 217 Kinkaid Avenue. City Manager Garza also presented the City Council with photos of the property. Assistant to City Manger Jackie Jansky stated that the building official Ronnie Bollom has reviewed the property location and carport plans. She said that the carport would be installed under the existing eaves of the house; therefore, gutters were not needed and water run off would be on Mr. Arnold's property.

She also stated that the next-door neighbor, Mr. Joe Wisnieski, provided a letter indicating he had no objections to the installation of the carport. After some discussion, Councilmember Terry D. Lynch moved to approve the request by Mr. Richard Arnold for an over 50% variance request for the placement of a 10' x 21' portable carport at Pecan Acres, Block 1, Lot 34A; 217 Kincaid Avenue. Councilmember Alfred Bryant seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

The eleventh item on the agenda was to review and consider a request by the City Staff for the City of Wharton to acquire the following Tax Resale Properties:

A. **Resolution:** A resolution of the Wharton City Council accepting a tract or parcel of land measuring 1118.06 feet, more or less, out of Lot 13 in Block 59 of the City of Wharton from the Wharton County Taxing Entities.

City Manager Andres Garza, Jr. presented a copy of the letter dated April 7, 2011 from Mr. Charles A. "Chip" Sutton, Attorney with Linebarger, Goggan, Blair & Sampson, LLP, the City's delinquent tax attorney firm, providing the information regarding two (2) parcels of properties (Items A & B above) that the City could acquire for the Wharton Flood Reduction Project (Levee Project) to the City Council. City Manager Garza advised the City Council these properties would be for future use on the levy project. He stated that if the properties were not acquired through tax resale that the City may have to purchase the properties at their appraised cost in the future. After some discussion, Councilmember Alfred Bryant moved to approve a resolution accepting a tract or parcel of land measuring 1118.06 feet, more or less, out of Lot 13 in Block 59 of the City of Wharton from the Wharton County Taxing Entities. City of Wharton Resolution No. 2011-28 reads as follows:

The twelfth item on the agenda was to review and consider a resolution of the Wharton City Council approving a professional engineering services agreement between the City of Wharton and IDC Inc. for the FM 102 Relocation or FM 1301 to Hwy. 59 Extension and Overpass Project and authorizing the Mayor of the City of Wharton to execute the agreement. City Manger Andres Garza, Jr. presented a draft resolution approving the professional engineering services agreement with IDC Inc. for the FM 102 Relocation or FM 1301 to Hwy. 59 Extension and Overpass Project. City Manager Garza said the City Staff was working with the firm to arrive at the additional cost for the FM 1301 to Hwy. 59 expansion design. City Manager Garza added the City Staff had been in contact with the TxDOT Yoakum District regarding the City Council's April 18<sup>th</sup> decision to proceed with the environmental clearance for the FM 102 Relocation and the FM 1301 to Hwy. 59 Expansion. City Manager Garza advised the City Council that the professional engineering services agreement was being revised to reflect the City Council's

decision and the TxDOT Advance Funding Agreement was also being revised to reflect the City Council's decision. After some discussion, Councilmember Donald Mueller moved to approve a resolution of the Wharton City Council approving a professional engineering services agreement between the City of Wharton and IDC Inc. for the FM 102 Relocation or FM 1301 to Hwy. 59 Extension and Overpass Project and authorizing the Mayor of the City of Wharton to execute the agreement which would only include the following:

- (1) preliminary engineering for FM 102 extension (FM 102 to FM 1301) for environmental approval in the amount of \$225,170.00,
- (2) plans, specifications, and estimates for railroad overpass, intersection with SH 60 and FM 1301 tie-in in the amount of \$397,728.00,
- (3) right of way mapping for FM 102 extension in the amount of \$49,700.00, and
- (4) preliminary engineering for FM 1301 extension to US 59 (including 2-way frontage road and entrance and exit ramps [for environmental approvals]) in the amount of \$95,263.00,

and in accordance with the City of Wharton Resolution No. 2011- 30, which reads as follows:

The thirteenth item on the agenda was to review and consider a resolution of the Wharton City Council authorizing the Mayor of the City of Wharton to execute a Memorandum of Understanding regarding the Adoption of the Texas Department of Transportation's Federally – Approved Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program by the City of Wharton, Texas. City Manager Andres Garza, Jr. presented a copy of the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program and Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to the City Council. City Manager Garza addressed the City Council and informed them since the City of Wharton would let the construction contract for the Sidewalk Accessibility and Historic Streetscape Project, the City was required to adopt a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) program. The eighteenth item on the agenda was to review and consider the Status Report on City of Wharton Projects. City Manager Andres Garza, Jr. presented copy of his memorandum dated April 25, 2011 to the City Council providing the Status Report on City of Wharton Projects, which read as follows:

### FLOOD REDUCTION (LEVEE) PROJECT

The U.S. Army Corp of Engineers (USACE) Lower Colorado River Phase I Report - City of Wharton Flood Prevention Project and Recommended report was located at the Wharton County Library and the office of the City of Wharton City Secretary for viewing or the report may be viewed on line at <a href="http://www.swf.usace.army.mil/pubdata/notices/LowerColorado/">http://www.swf.usace.army.mil/pubdata/notices/LowerColorado/</a>.

On February 1, 2011 the Public Works Committee met to discuss issues with the levee. The group reviewed the possible levee realignment that would tie in with Caney Creek just Southeast of Glen Flora. In addition, the committee reviewed those areas where buyouts and/or relocations may be needed. The discussion focused on whether to avoid the buyouts by building a floodwall or continue with the earthen levee and buyout property owners. The consensus was that it would be more feasible to continue with the earthen levee. Public Works staff is collecting data for Halff Associates to assist in the final design.

#### **DRAINAGE:**

### 1. Santa Fe Outfall Channel.

The Public Works Department has finished excavation up to Alabama Road. The Public Works Department will now focus on installing grade stabilization structures and installing other best management practices needed to control erosion. Excavation will continue weather permitting.

2. Highway 60 & Old Lane City Road Drainage Improvements

The construction plans have been approved by the TxDOT Yoakum District Office.

City Staff was currently preparing cost estimates on the project and obtaining the necessary right of way needed for the project.

#### **WATER/SEWER IMPROVEMENTS:**

1. Ahldag Addition Sanitary Sewer Project – TxCDBG Contract No. R729710.

This project was complete. The City has a one-year warranty with AR Turnkee on this project.

2. Water Storage Tank Maintenance Program.

Negotiations with Utility Service Company have been terminated. City Staff will be presenting to the City Council an engineering contract for those improvements.

3. Quick Connect/Transfer Switch Project

Quick connects and transfer switches are being installed at all city lift stations, city water plants, City Hall, the Fire Station, EMS Headquarters, WWTP #1, and WWTP#2. Electrical Automation Controls was approximately 90% complete.

4. Pressure Switches at City Water Plants

This project is complete; however, the Public Works staff continues to monitor the system to insure that it is working properly.

5. Energy Efficiency Audit

City Staff is waiting for the final report from Siemens Industry, Inc.

#### STREET IMPROVEMENTS

1. FM 102 Relocation and Overpass Project

The Consultant Selection Committee recommended IDC, Inc. as the engineering firm on this project, which was accepted by the City Council on March 14, 2011. City Staff met with IDC, Inc. and TxDOT at the Yoakum District Office on March 17, 2011. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the engineering services contract between the City, TxDOT, and IDC, Inc. IDC, Inc. will be finalizing the scope of work for TxDOT's review to insure all project elements are covered in the final contract. IDC, Inc. will finalize the draft agreement for review by the City.

2. 2010 Street Improvement Program

This project was complete.

3. 2011-2012 Street Improvement Program

Public Works Staff is currently identifying and preparing cost estimates for possible street improvements during the next fiscal year.

4. Wharton Sidewalk Accessibility and Historic Streetscape Project

The City of Wharton received the fully executed contract from the Texas Department of Transportation. Finance Director Joan Andel, Assistant to City Manager Jackie Jansky, and Public Works Director Carter Miska, P.E. attended the Local Government Project Procedures Training held March 8 – 9, 2011. The City Council approved the resolution designating the Consultant Selection Committee for the project on March 14<sup>th</sup>. Additionally, the City Staff submitted the Public Notice to the Wharton Journal Spectator and to approximately 20 engineering/architectural firms requesting their Statements of Qualifications. The RFQ's were April 19, 2011 and they are being distributed to the Consultant Selection Committee.

### **OTHER PROJECTS**

1. Fire Station Expansion Project

Public Works Staff completed the construction of the earthen pad required for the new building foundation on February 22, 2011. A soil testing lab was on-site and verified that all compaction and moisture requirements were met. Public Works was now in the process of providing a sewer tap and water tap for the new building.

Facilities Maintenance Director Bob Baker was the project manager and will be soliciting the necessary quotes and bids to move the project forward. The building has been ordered.

### WHARTON REGIONAL AIRPORT

1. Capital Improvement Drainage Project.

The TxDOT has negotiated an engineering contract with O'Malley Engineers to design the Drainage Project for the airport being conducted under the 2010 Capital Improvement Program. The City Staff met with the State and O'Malley Engineers on March 17, 2011 to kick-off the project.

After some discussion, no action was taken.

The nineteenth item on the agenda was to review and consider City Council, Committee, Commissions and Boards Reports:
