MINUTES OF CITY OF WHARTON REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING APRIL 8, 2013

Mayor Pro-Tem Don Mueller declared a Regular Meeting duly open for the transaction of business at 7:00 P.M. Mayor Pro-Tem Don Mueller led the opening devotion and the pledge of allegiance.

The second item on the agenda was Roll Call and Excuses Absences. After some discussion, Councilmember Terry David Lynch moved to excuse Mayor Domingo Montalvo, Jr. Councilmember Al Bryant seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

The third item on the agenda was Public Comments. No comments were given.

The fourth item on the agenda was the Wharton Moment. Councilmember Russell Machann congratulated the Wharton High School tennis team for advancing to the regional tennis tournament.

The fifth item on the agenda was to review and consider reading of the minutes from the regular meeting held March 11, 2013 and the regular meeting held March 25, 2013. After some discussion, Councilmember Karen Schulz moved to approve the minutes from the regular meeting held March 11, 2013 and the regular meeting held March 25, 2013. Councilmember Al Bryant seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

The sixth item discussed on the agenda was to review and consider City of Wharton Budget Calendar for fiscal year 2013 – 2014. City of Wharton Finance Director Joan Andel presented the proposed City of Wharton Budget Calendar for fiscal year 2013- 2014. After some discussion, no action was taken.

The seventh item on the agenda was to review and consider City of Wharton EMS Department:

- A. City Council acceptance of a grant in the amount of \$50,000 from the M.G. and Lillie A. Johnson Foundation, Inc. for the purchase of an ambulance for the City of Wharton Emergency Medical Service (EMS) Department.
- B. **Resolution:** A resolution of the Wharton City Council approving an agreement between the City of Wharton and Frazier Co./Dallas Dodge Chrysler Jeep for the purchase of an ambulance through the Houston-Galveston Area Council Cooperative Purchasing Program and authorizing the Mayor of the City of Wharton to execute any and all documents related to said purchase.

City Manager Andres Garza, Jr. presented a copy of the letter dated March 25, 2013 from Mr. Robert Halepeska, Executive Vice President of the M.G. and Lillie A. Johnson Foundation, Inc. awarding the City of Wharton EMS Department a grant in the amount of \$50,000.00 for the purchase of an ambulance. City Manager Garza stated that City Council acceptance of the grant was required. City Manager Garza presented a memorandum from EMS Director John Kowalik regarding the need to replace Unit 1121 and a copy of a draft resolution approving an agreement with Frazier Co./Dallas Dodge Chrysler Jeep for the purchase of an ambulance through the Houston-Galveston Area Council Cooperative Purchasing Program. City Manager Garza further presented a copy of the quote provided by Frazier Co./Dallas Dodge Chrysler Jeep. EMS Director John Kowalik stated that Unit 1121 was experiencing mechanic issues. After some discussion, Councilmember Russell Machann moved to accept the grant in the amount of \$50,000 from the M.G. and Lillie A. Johnson Foundation, Inc. and approve City of Wharton Resolution No. 2013-23, which read as follows:

A RESOLUTION OF THE WHARTON CITY COUNCIL APPROVING AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF WHARTON AND FRAZER CO./DALLAS DODGE CHRYSLER JEEP FOR THE PURCHASE OF AN AMBULANCE THROUGH THE HOUSTON-GALVESTON AREA COUNCIL COOPERATIVE PURCHASING PROGRAM AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF WHARTON TO EXECUTE ANY AND ALL DOCUMENTS RELATED TO SAID PURCHASE.

WHEREAS, the City of Wharton received a quote from Frazer Co./Dallas Dodge Chrysler Jeep for purchase of an ambulance in the amount of \$133,575.00; and

WHEREAS, Frazer Co./Dallas Dodge Chrysler Jeep is a member of the Houston-Galveston Area Council Cooperative Purchasing Program; and

WHEREAS, the Wharton City Council wishes to approve an agreement with Frazer Co./Dallas Dodge Chrysler Jeep for the purchase of an ambulance through the Houston-Galveston Area Council Cooperative Purchasing Program; and

WHEREAS, the Wharton City Council wishes to authorize the Mayor of the City of Wharton to execute any and all documents related to said purchase.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WHARTON, TEXAS as follows:

- Section I. That the City Council hereby approves an agreement with Frazer Co./Dallas Dodge Chrysler Jeep for the purchase of an ambulance in the amount of \$133,575.00 through the Houston-Galveston Area Council Cooperative Purchasing Program.
- Section II. That the Mayor of the City of Wharton is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents related to said purchase.
- Section III. That this resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage.
