CITY OF WHARTON REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING JUNE 12, 2017

Mayor Tim Barker declared a Regular Meeting duly open for the transaction of business at 7:00 P.M at City Hall 120 E. Caney Street Wharton, TX. Councilmember Russell Machann led the opening devotion and Mayor Barker led the pledge of allegiance.

The second item on the agenda was Roll Call and Excuses Absences. All members were present.

The third item on the agenda was Public Comments. No comments were given.

The fourth item on the agenda was the Wharton Moment. City Manager Andres Garza, Jr. congratulated Councilmember Terry Freese on his retirement from the Wharton Independent School District.

The fifth item on the agenda was to review and consider the reading of the minutes from the regular meetings held May 8, 2017 and May 22, 2017. After some discussion, Councilmember Al Bryant moved to approve the reading of the minutes from the regular meeting held on May 8, 2017 and May 22, 2017. Councilmember Russell Machann seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

The sixth item discussed on the agenda was to review and consider Wharton Economic Development Corporation Fiscal Year 2017-2018 Annual Budget. City Manager Andres Garza, Jr. informed the City Council that in their packets was the Proposed Wharton

Economic Development Corporation Fiscal Year 2017-2018 Annual Budget submitted by the Wharton Economic Development Corporation Executive Director Mr. Chad Odom. Mr. Odom stated the changes for the Wharton Economic Development Corporation Fiscal Year 2017-2018 Annual Budget. After some discussion, Councilmember Russell Machann moved to approve the Wharton Economic Development Corporation Fiscal Year 2017-2018 Annual Budget. Councilmember Al Bryant seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

The seventh item discussed on agenda was to review and consider a resolution of the Wharton City Council approving the City of Wharton 2017 City Street Improvements Project and authorizing the Mayor of the City of Wharton to execute all documents related to said approval. City Manager Andres Garza, Jr. stated that the Public Works Committee met on June 8, 2017 and voted to recommend to the City Council the 2017 Street Improvement Program. Public Works Director Wade Wendt presented the roadways that were slated for improvement with the program. Finance Director Joan Andel stated the funds for the project would be utilized out of the 2011 and 2015 Bond Funds and the current Capital Improvement Fund. After some discussion, Councilmember Al Bryant moved to approve City of Wharton Resolution No. 2017-53, which read as follows:

CITY OF WHARTON RESOLUTION NO. 2017-53

A RESOLUTION OF THE WHARTON CITY COUNCIL APPROVING THE CITY OF WHARTON 2017 STREET IMPROVEMENT PROJECT AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF WHARTON TO EXECUTE ALL DOCUMENTS RELATING TO SAID APPROVAL.

- **WHEREAS,** The Wharton City Council wishes to approve the 2017 Street Improvement Project as presented by staff; and,
- **WHEREAS,** The Wharton City Council wishes to allocate funding for said project from the following 3 sources: the 2011 Bond Fund, the 2015 Bond Fund and the Capital Improvement Fund, and,
- **WHEREAS,** The Wharton City Council wishes to authorize the Mayor of the City of Wharton to execute the agreements on behalf of the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WHARTON, TEXAS as follows:

Section I. The Wharton City Council hereby authorizes the Mayor of the City of Wharton, Texas, to execute documents for the City of Wharton 2017 Street Improvement Project.

Section II. The Wharton City Council hereby allocate funding for said project from the following 3 sources: the 2011 Bond Fund, the 2015 Bond Fund and the Capital Improvement Fund.

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Section III. That this resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage.

Mayor Tim Barker returned to open session at 7:35 p.m. After some discussion, no action was taken.

The tenth item on the agenda was to review and consider a resolution of the Wharton City Council adopting the Title VI Plan & First Annual Report and authorizing the Mayor of the City of Wharton to execute all documents related to said adoption. City Manager Andres Garza, Jr. stated that the City Staff was contacted by TxDOT Contract Compliance Specialist Mike McElroy regarding the requirement to have a Title VI Plan in place for the City. City Manager Garza said the City Staff had created a plan and after review by TxDOT was advised to present the review to the City Council for adoption. He said the plan would require yearly reviews, reporting and adoptions. Community Development Coordinator Gwyn Teves stated that the City was required to have City Council adoption and approval before final submittal to TxDOT. Mrs. Laney said the plan addressed discrimination in any capacity and laid out a complaint procedure for any occurrences should it be necessary. After some discussion, Councilmember Terry Freese moved to approve City of Wharton Resolution No. 2017-54, which read as follows:

A RESOLUTION OF THE WHARTON CITY COUNCIL ADOPTING THE TITLE VI NONDISCRIMINATION PLAN & FIRST ANNUAL REPORT AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF WHARTON TO EXECUTE ALL DOCUMENTS RELATING TO SAID ADOPTION.

- **WHEREAS,** The City of Wharton has prepared the 2016 Annual Workplan and Accomplishment Report; and,
- **WHEREAS,** The Wharton City Council wishes to authorize the Mayor of the City of Wharton to execute all documents relating to said plan.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WHARTON, TEXAS:

- **SECTION I.** The Wharton City Council hereby approves the 2017 Title VI Plan and 2016 Annual Workplan and Accomplishment Report.
- **SECTION II.** The Wharton City Council hereby authorizes the Mayor of the City of Wharton to execute all documents related to said plan.
- **SECTION III.** That this resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage.
