City of Wharton Preparation for Beryl

Wharton, TX, July 7, 2024

The City of Wharton continues to monitor Tropical Storm/Hurricane Beryl. The National Weather Service is reporting as of 5 p.m. today, Beryl remains a tropical storm and the intensity has not changed much since morning. The storm continues to track NNW across the Gulf toward the Texas coast, at 65 mph. Beryl is still forecast to make landfall as a category 1 hurricane. NWS reports no changes to wind; surge; flood watches; warnings, or expected rainfall. The threat of a few tornadoes in bands will increase this evening and remain through much of Monday. Residents should expect high winds and possible flash flooding.

GFL's garbage collection has been suspended until further notice. Please do not place your garbage at the curb and secure your receptacle as best you can from the wind.
